KIPP IN STOCKTON

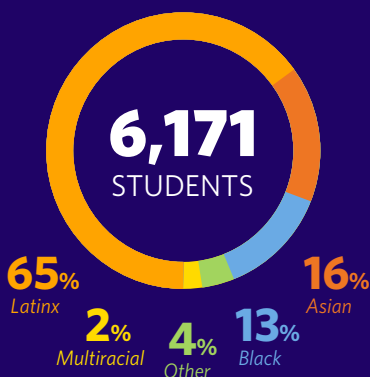
KIPP is a network of free, public charter schools, open to all students. In Northern California, there are 16 KIPP schools, which educate over 6,000 students in transitional kindergarten (TK) through twelfth grade. Building upon the successes and learnings of our previously established schools, KIPP is opening our first school in Stockton in fall 2021. Our vision is to be a part of a thriving public education system in Stockton, and, over time, work with students in elementary, middle, and high school.

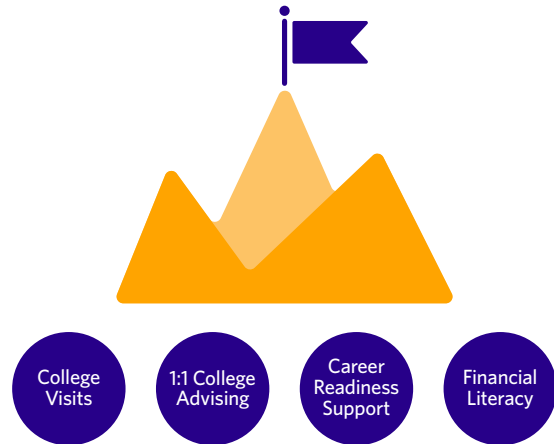
KIPP Northern California high school alumni are over **four times** as likely to graduate from college as their peers.
